The Financial Crisis, the Great Recession, and the Future

The recent Great Recession and the global financial crisis that triggered it are undoubtedly the most significant economic events of recent decades. Just as the Great Depression decisively influenced economic thinking for generations, and perhaps permanently, we expect that these events will do so as well. A tremendous amount has already been written about them, but they remain incompletely understood and controversial. To help further our understanding, we are issuing this call for papers to appear in a special issue of, or symposium within, the *Critique of Political Economy*.

Papers that address the short- and or long-term causes of these events, or their significance, or their consequences are all welcome, as are review essays and book reviews. We encourage submission of both heterodox and mainstream contributions. Submissions will be reviewed according to standard *COPE* procedures. They must conform to our scholarship guidelines and our standard guidelines concerning length and other matters.
